Our wicking bed project is progressing and we are planning on having a workshop on how you can do this at home in the near future.

Thanks to a generous donation by Shane Hunter we now have a working worm farm. Our second worm farm is on the way, thanks to some great work by a few very strong members who managed to deliver and lift a cast iron bath into place!

#### PRIVATE GARDEN PLOTS

We are getting some interest for private garden plots so if you would like to reserve one please contact us to talk about your particular requirements as we may be able to develop something specific to your needs.

Costs will be \$90 a year for a bed 1.5m x 3m. The cost will include access to compost created at the garden and all gardening tools. It will also include limited supply of products such as garden stakes, Wetta soil and organic fertilisers.

All plot owners will need to be Garden Members and will need to sign a charter of garden management.
