IN THE GARDEN

In the past few weeks we have begun to get the garden organised and have begun some small projects.

We have taken advantage of the great weather and planted our fruit trees and seedlings donated by Bunnings and Members into the ground.

We now have one complete garden bed, a herb spiral and we have begun building the composting bays.

It has been great to work with our Members and Friends on these projects. However, there is much more do and it our plan to continue holding busy bees every few weeks to help with some of the major projects and importantly to get together and meet new people and have some fun!

Our next Busy Bee will be held on 21 October when our main focus will be to make our Worm Farm and to continue with some of the garden bed construction.

PRIVATE GARDEN PLOTS

At present we have not developed private garden plots but this will commence shortly.

We encourage you to contact us to discuss your particular requirements as we may be able to develop something specific to your needs.

Costs will likely be about \$90 a year for a bed 1.5m x 3m. The cost will include access to compost created at the garden and all gardening tools. It will also include limited supply of products such as garden stakes, wetta soil and organic fertilisers.

All plot owners will need to be Garden Members and will need to sign a charter of garden management.

We expect there to be a good demand for plots and they will be allocated on a first come first served basis so if you are interested contact us to indicate your interest and ask any questions you may have.

DONATIONS

If you have any of the following items to help us with our Worm Farm we would love to hear from you.

- Shredded paper
- Wood suitable to make a worm farm frame to hold a cast iron bath—preferably jarrah or treated pine
- An door to act as a cover for the worm farm
- Worms!!
